3. Reports

Captains – Report circulated prior to the meeting, see below.

Coaching – We will be losing the 3 BSU coaches (Poppy, Ella, Anna) in the next 1-3 months. Need to consider how we will cover this.

Development Squad co-ordinator role is unfilled; JG has spoken to the co-ordinators and feels that this will need to be a direct approach. Any ideas, let JG know.

Discussion surrounding the resource required for the Development Squad, noted that expectations have been managed at the start of the LTR course with this cohort understanding the options at the end of the course and that there are a number who will not, in all likehood, progress into the main squads at the end of the course. These individuals will need a lot of support to help with their development. It is difficult to see how this resource will be provided particularly as the 2nd LTR course starts soon after the current course finishes. PSon has suggested that the octuple could be used on a Thursday evening and Sunday morning, it may be that some individuals wish to move into the social rowing group. There are advantages having one Development Squad (as happened last year). Recognised that we mustn't over-commit. In the short-term, Anna will have more time (for a short period before end June/July) to take on more coaching roles.

Action: JG, KG, JDy, TG to meet and make decisions about what happens at the end of this current course, the next LTR course (numbers, timing etc)

We need to maintain higher standards with regards to the cleanliness of boats and blades. A cleaning station with accessible cleaning materials will be set up in the boat house.

Action: JG to cover in RNs

Damaged boats are being returned to the boat house without being reported, crews are then having to fix these before they are able to go out.

Action: JG to cover in RNs

JDy has spoken to PK about a potential sculling camp (open to both men and women's squads). PK broadly happy with the suggested dates (possibly Mondays, Wednesdays and Sunday mornings), PK has free time in June. Anna might also be able to offer support.

Beginners (Adults) - Report circulated prior to the meeting, see below.

To note a thanks to everyone who is getting involved to support, these newbies are the future of the club and it is important that we support them.

Juniors – The kids managed 6th (J15 4X+, Albert, AJ, Ben, Sam & Ethan) and 7th (WJ14 1X, Liv) at JIRR which pretty much reflected the team positions. Newbies on Fridays now number 8 – PSen has not yet started any on Sunday mornings yet.

Volunteer co-ordinator – Nothing to progress

Go Row Indoor – GRI is trickling along, we are looking for new GRI instructors in readiness for when our current student instructors leave to prevent gap in cover.

BSU co-ordinator – Nothing to report

4. Boathouse Management Committee

Gravel – the insurers will not cover the gravel (the covering is not considered solid). AC waiting for Monkton and Uni of Bristol to respond. If no response by 30/4 this will be deemed as their consent for the work to be completed, funded from the maintenance reserve (~£7k including VAT). AC has looked at other cheaper alternatives but these are not practical.

We have now entered the new financial year; both Uni of Bristol and Monkton are aware that there will be an increase in costs (relating especially to energy costs and rent) and therefore the monthly contribution will increase. Agreed that this will start at the beginning of the next quarter.

6. Safety Report

Circulated prior to meeting. Nothing significant in incidents.

JG gave an overview of the national summary, general themes relating to heel restraints, good look out, care when recovering boats, good hygiene.

Boat cleaning will be covered in RNs (as above in Captain's report)

An updated RowSafe has been sent out, nothing major to report.



7. Events

Regatta – PSon currently dealing with entries, entries were suspended at the end of last week as we were getting near the point where the number of races entered implied we were at capacity. There is a huge waiting list, PSon is still waiting for Avon entries, particularly for the Juniors

Alastar Watson is organising the helper's rota, notification will be sent in due course. Noted that the Regatta will be starting ½ hour earlier, boating from 8.15am.

Midsummer madness – JG suggesting that we run another club event towards end June, replicating last year's format.

Avon Bluefriars Head (8 October 23) - This is our first event of the Autumn 2023 - Spring 2024 season, 'small boats' (fours, quads and smaller boats). JDw will be contacting the Marinas and the owner of Barnsdale Park field over the summer on behalf of all our events. Detailed organisation will get under way in due course and the event will be run on the standard lines we've developed for all our Head races.

8. Membership & Subs

Membership – Report circulated prior to the meeting, see below. Nothing to add.

Membership categories are blossoming, once the LTR has finished, PSon hopeful that the GRI categories will settle down. PSon to liaise with Ella (before the end of May) re BSU membership.

New members & Leavers - Report circulated prior to meeting, see below. Nothing to add.

9. **Finances** – Report circulated prior to the meeting, see below.

Financial report – Spring Head funds (just of £8K) have come into the bank account.

JSon has provided the first draft of the club accounts for the year ending March 2023. Subs are slightly under from the previous year. The expenditure column now includes Coaching Expenditure for the first time, in the year just finished it was just over £2k.

Discussion surrounding club insurance and the cover this provides for volunteers. JSon confirmed that our British Rowing event insurance appears to cover anyone (whether or not they are a Club member) when they volunteer to do anything for the club for affiliated events. The question specifically relates to unaffiliated events (eg Midsummer Madness local club event, junior time trials etc) and general club activities. The Club insurance covers Club members who volunteer but would not cover a non-Club member volunteering.

Action: JSon/TG to explore further



The next big expenditure is the women's quad which will be paid around mid-May. JG is also putting in an order for sculling blades and new shoes.

10. Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

The club received the grant for 3x stabilisers, they are now at the club. With JG help, will look at fitting them and trying them in the next few weeks. They will be available for anyone to use.

We are in the process of reaching out to local organisations for participants for adaptive rowing programme.

11. **AOB**

2023 AGM meeting – date: Sunday 24 September

Mailchimp – KP to look further at the functionality to see whether this can be used for updating member details etc.

Action: KP to look at further functionality of Mailchimp

AC provided an overview of the Rowing Foundation and the grant funding we receive towards new boats for exclusive use of juniors. Discussion at the last Rowing Foundation meeting surrounding adults using a RF-grant funded junior boat. As a club we would need to think about the circumstances of use. JG to discuss further with PSen, if we conclude that we want to give exclusive use to a senior crew, we would need to discuss with the Rowing Foundation and make offer of repayment of grant (£3k contribution).

Action: JG to liaise with PSen re RF boat use

JG is currently looking at Level 1 and 2 coaching courses. There are no courses in the region this year, JG to speak to PSen.

Action: JG to progress potential coaching courses with PSen

Umpire training to be offered to the club members. We do need more umpires in the region – we have 70 in the region but need 500 umpireships across the year.

Action: JG to include in RNs, TG/JDy to ask squads

Dragon race day (Dragon paddle day) is being organised by Kayak club at Minerva, Bank Holiday 29 May. JG to send details out nearer time.

Action: JG to include in RNs

Next Sunday, Bath SUP group (organised out of jolly sailor) is organising a litter pick. JG has agreed for them to use our carpark and facilities in the afternoon. Aiming to tackle the rubbish up on our straight.

JG would like to get some of our blades repainted. Volunteers will be needed.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Again, some significant disruption to on water activities due to inclement weather & high / fast river conditions, however we finally seem to be getting some better conditions and all squads and our new LTR members are getting some good water time. LTR is going well and getting a lot of member support, thank you.

With Abingdon Head having been cancelled, the only races since the last committee meeting have been the JIRR trials at Saltford and then the JIRR at NWSC this last weekend. We had 2 crews entered from ACRC as part of the WAGS & Wales Team. I hope the team did well and everyone had a good couple of days racing at NWSC. Thanks to Penny for co-ordinating our regional team again.

Looking ahead we have crews at BUCS, Evesham and Wallingford this weekend – good luck to everyone who is racing. Then we get to our own BAR on 13th May (with entries already suspended). Lot's to do but I'm sure we'll put on a good show as always.

As Squad Co-ords we're looking ahead to which regattas we will plan to attend in the next few months. We also propose to re-run the "Midsummer Madness" again this year and will be looking to put a date in the diary for this, perhaps in late June; for discussion.

Many thanks to Kim for volunteering to take on the BMC Sec role.

We still need someone to step up to take on the Dev Squad Co-ordinator role. Some direct approaches needed (as discussed at our Squad Co-ords meeting yesterday)

We will also need to think about how we continue to resource coaching for the squads as Poppy will be leaving us at the end of June.

I would like to improve how we clean & look after our equipment. The high standards we had in place during Covid have lapsed to an unacceptable level & need to be re-instated. See also comments on the safety report. I'll talk more about this at the meeting and will be covering this in the next RN.

Linked to looking after equipment, we need to remind members to report damage (because it isn't always), to rerig boats in a reasonable time after returning from events and we need to set a program to get all our blades repainted. Again I'll cover in RN.

Our new 4x- is likely to be ready around 3^{rd} week of May (perhaps collect at Nat Schools – tbc)

MEN'S SQUAD REPORT

Water and land training over the summer/regatta season

We are transitioning from Head racing to Regatta racing. The past month has been relatively quiet with poor weather, difficult river conditions and the Easter break intervening.

The level of uptake for regatta racing remains uncertain but the indications are that appetite remains limited. An initial questionnaire around squad interest in competitions up to the end of May elicited a minimal response. It is proposed shortly to send out a further questionnaire in relation to identified target events through the



second part of the season and to support this with more pro-active co-ordinator encouragement.

However, I am not optimistic that the overall picture with regard to regatta racing will change dramatically in the short term. The build up of competitive confidence and more advanced skills is a work in progress. It is likely in my view that the focus of summer outings this year at least will end up being broader than simple commitment to side by side racing, concentrating more on individual development, for example in smaller boats, and supporting integration of new squad members (see below). Darrel and Steve organised a programme of coached outings. This was substantially

Darrel and Steve organised a programme of coached outings. This was substantially torpedoed by the weather – and the take up was limited. But those of us who participated benefited hugely. Massive thanks to them.

Squad meeting on 26 March at 10am in the clubhouse

We held a meeting. This covered a range of topics including in particular the squad's thoughts on the summer season. A short minute of the meeting was distributed.

Boat Care

Jon raised this at the squad meeting. It has been agreed at the co-ordinators' meeting (23 April) that there should be a dedicated station with cleaning materials and implements within the boat house near the signing out book. This will be backed up by an email to the squad. We need to look after our boats better.

LTR

From my perspective, there has been reasonably good support from the men for the LTR programme. There are a number of promising potential recruits. We need to hang on to these as club members and I am optimistic that there is good commitment among experienced squad members to assist with ongoing development in mixed ability crews. A certain amount of relevant admin, particularly with more advanced LTR graduates, can be managed as part of the overall squad planning. But we need a co-ordinator and I have to twist a few arms.

WOMEN'S SQUAD REPORT

General

Squad meeting held on 15th April.

We had some discussion about evening rowing which didn't really take off last year. Some expressed a preference for rowing in more established crews during the evenings but there was a suggestion that people could put a note on the WhatsApp group if they want to row so that others can buddy up at the same time or form crews if enough people available which we will start to do.

Squad were reminded that people will need to book boats in advance if planning their own outings and also remember to signed boats in and out when on the water. Quite a few of the squad have been supporting with LTR and more have been encouraged to get involved - these are future members of the women's squad and we need to support their development and help them feel involved in the squad and Club!

Hoping to get them into the Octuple this week.

I think they are all having a really positive experience and the level of support from the club is fantastic. However, I am conscious that we need to start making plans for the end of the course and I need to start thinking about the next batch. The concern is that whilst this course has been well supported by volunteers, the increasing demands on people's time will obviously stretch resources on all fronts, as we have to support people in various stages of development.

I have 30 interested people for the summer taster with an additional waiting list for places. Lots of enquiries, getting one a day at the moment, but need to give some thought on how to manage this given we need to find someone for the development squad role and don't want to over commit ourselves.

NOTE 4 SITE DEVELOPMENT

In May 2013 the Trustees of Avon County Rowing Club signed a Project Agreement in relation to the site at Selfford. The other parties were the Duchy of Comwall,

the University of Bristol and Monkton Combe School.

The Agreement committed the Trustees and the Club to pay certain sums of money and to sign sub-leases with the University of Bristol and Monkton Combe School. In return, the Agreement committed the Duchy to issue a 60 year Head Lease to the Trustees and to have new boathouses and a facility block constructed. The new buildings belong to the leaseholder and the sub-tenants have rights to occupy designated parts of them.

Construction of the new buildings commenced in August 2013. The buildings were completed in August 2014 and at 31 March 2015 Avon County Rowing Club had no remaining expenditure commitments. The total expenditure from Club resources was £71,521.

The remainder of the Club's share of the cost was met by grants and donations, including £80,000 from British Rowing and £50,000 from Sport England.

The Club does not propose to include any value relating to the new buildings in its Balance Sheet and therefore the net amounts paid by the Club after grants and donations were included in the Income & Expenditure account as an Exceptional item of cost.

The expenditure incurred in the year to 31 March 2017 was the Club's share of expenditure on installing improved sewage disposal facilities

26.3.23	At JIRR Trials at Avon County . MCS OJ15 2x ran into bushes on tow path side at 800m during race Div 2. Boat stayed upright but securely wedged into bank by stream. Rowers taken into launch (Jon & Andy) which then allowed us to free the boat. All taken back to landing stages and handed to coach Matt. Boys both ok.

- Revisit need to arrange a FA course? There was very little response to RN.
- We need to revisit boat (inside & out) cleaning and & blade cleaning for several reasons
 - River pollution
 - Hygiene & welfare
 - Care of our equipment.
