**Captains** – Report circulated prior to the meeting, see below.

Dobby falling off the trestles has prompted a conversation regarding refurbishing our fleet. JG to start going through the fleet, ranking them 1-5 (how poorly they look), with a view to refurbishing in order when funds allow.

The ergs were all serviced last week. JG proposed purchasing a second-hand modelC with MP3 monitor (£250) from Concept2 R Us, it has low useage and all agreed, a good purchase.

JG currently drafting a list of DIY jobs, will see whether University and Monkton able to help.

Rowing tank – JG/PSen/PSon have been to both Radley and Molsey, have had the opportunity to talk to the individual who installed the tank, plus several rowers. There is an awful lot of work to do with spec and working out how to get money. Molsey will send details of the tank (Dreyer), they have also provided details of funders. The Radley tank is not a Dreyer, PSen has emailed the architect for details and will report back. There are pros/cons for both styles of tanks. Retrofit style Molsey style if existing building. If new build building, Radley perhaps becomes more feasible.

Bath Lock and Key have replaced the broken lock. Discussion regarding moving the lock to a lower place on the door to make wheelchair accessible. #### 4. Boathouse Management Committee

JG to meet with AW/AC to talk through a long list.

Wessex water have had planning approval to carry out works in the top field; works will start after our regatta in May. Reptile relocation started today (slow



worms, newts and grass snakes), this will take a couple of months. Freya/Wessex water has offered to show anyone that is interested. Reptile fence will be installed next week to keep them near the matting, there will be daily checks under the mats for the foreseeable future.

Field will be available for regatta.

Wessex – will put in new permanent entrance, once all the works have been completed. They will dismantle the walls, reusing the stone to block off the existing entrance. There will be an improved entrance, away from the tree, with a new track to get to the railway tunnel. There will be a lot of additional stabilised surface which will be useful for our events. Will cut down all of the nettles and brambles that are growing along the stonework. Will have a far more useable field in the long-term.

6. Safety Report - Report circulated prior to the meeting, see below

Emergency fire point signage being prepared, EBG will circulate. JG/EBG currently finalising all the posters and will then get printed.

Discussion regarding RNLI advice for rescue blanks. Noted that the foil sheets do work well, we also have dryrobes that were purchased for our events, specifically for use in launches on race days. We could put these in the launches for our outings – although the safety launches are Monktons, we need to discuss this with Monkton to determine what is already provided.

#### 7. Events

**Spring Head** – it was very disappointing to have to cancel. More rain and snow than thought. Had full entry, we had to close several weeks before usual because of the high numbers. People who entered understood the reason why. We will have lost some money due to expendinture on toilets, bbq -~£900. JD have written to CART to see if we can either reclaim or carry it forward.

#### Regatta – Sat 11 May -

BROE has been open a few days, already got 24 entries.



Things are getting organised. Json has been in contact with the Bath Soft Cheese Company (Kelston) who own the whole stretch of fields along the regatta course. When asked for permission to put some of the umpires on the far side, they are keen to put spectators on that side. The Regatta committee has been supportive of the idea, there will be more atmosphere and provision of a better PA system. Discussion regarding the logistics of transporting spectators across to the club side, also acknowledged that if BSCC provide catering, we may see a reduction in our catering revenue (although we would not need to fund the PA system costs).

#### **EDI REPORT**

I have researched funding opportunities for a lift for the club house, please see attached. I suggest that the National Lottery Community Fund would be the first target (as it could potentially cover the whole cost) and then perhaps Grantscape (which is the landfill trust). I have checked we meet the criteria for these grants, and we do (for disability/inequality related applications), but obviously this is subject to approval.

- However, in the first instance I need to go back to the original clubhouse contractors and check which lift company they had in mind. This is due to the heated flooring and the allocated space in the flooring that the contractors allowed for a future lift installation. Before knowing this, Emma from Canoe Avon obtained some quotes but not all of these will be viable options. Anyway, once those logistics are covered and we have viable quotes for the lift and contractural work, I will check with the Boathouse Management Committee that I can go forward with this project by first obtaining a grant. It all looks promising.
- I have also included some suggestions for other/non-lift projects, such as applying for a grant for a stable Wintech, as the viruses aren't suitable for adaptive rowing...I'm thinking of targeting Sport England for this is the committee in agreement that I can apply for this grant for 1 to 2 stable Wintech's....
- Once we get actively started on this whole EDI venture, I think there could be some exciting opportunities and projects for the future (very early days)
- Poster and info forms have been sent to We Get It the cancer support charity for the taster day on 19th May
- Jon has kindly retrieved the stabiliser floats out of the store and we are looking to test these out....having tried 3 times so far and been scuppered
- The backpacks for coaches are here...I just need to fill them/potentially purchase items...
- Alex Fraser has organised an indoor rowing promotional event/course for special educational needs students at Filton College where he works. From Alex:
- The initiative started with a positive discussion with some autistic learners at SGS Foundation Department about rowing. They expressed an interest in having a go at indoor rowing access to sports is poor in our department at Filton. I canvassed various coaches at ACRC and promoted the idea with SGS Colleagues (Head of Dept' & tutors) who decided to run with the idea, expanding it into a 10 course of mixed activities, with learners earning a basic qualification. Learners generally have Education & Health Care Plans, lots with autism and or ADHD. One has cerebral palsy and another an Aquired Brain Injury. Course starts 12th April, Mondays or Thursday, 4-4.45pm, ends in June. Angie S has offered to help on 2 sessions, subject to getting time off work for volunteering. We plan to start very gently due to poor base level of fitness and keep activities fun. I would like to borrow 2 ergs and we have a third Concept 2 available from a tutor. A qualified Sports Teacher will be present at all sessions.
- We also need to think about installing some items in the accessible toilet shower, such as a shower seat and handrails, as advised by the wheelchair user at Canoe Avon. I took a photo of the accessible toilet/shower at Glos, so have an idea of what we need (which I'm sure you don't need to see but we



need at least 2 handrails that are on hinges, and a shower seat that folds back when not in use). The table will need to come out of that room (if it's still there...and the room needs not to be filled with other items). Jon is aware the mirror/and shower cord needs to be lowered and is on to this. I will look at getting costs at some point for the rails/seat, and I guess we could potentially look at one of the grant options for that as well.

- I need to write something for Abbie for our website...hopefully having something on our website that talks about inclusive/accessible rowing will generate some interest at some point
- At some point the EDI coaches will visit Just Row Glos to get some knowledge/hands on experience of the work Indiajane and the coaches do there
- Please tell friends/family about accessible rowing at Avon:)

Question: does our RA for taster days cover us for the EDI taster day, or do I need to amend this?

#### **CAPTAIN'S REPORT**

Unfortunately, a combo of dangerous river state & snow prevented ASH going ahead. Very frustrating. Many thanks to Jim & his team though for doing all the hard work to pull it together. It would have been a brilliant event...

#### **WOMEN'S SQUAD REPORT**

#### **General**

The last few weeks have continued to be frustrating in terms of weather which has impacted training for crews.

The pre-outing dynamic warm-up has become a part of the early session outing and it well attended by many of the crew members .... As well as being better warmed up it is also feels like a really positive way to start the morning together.



#### Racing Past and Future

We finally managed to get some racing in this month after having to cancel ASH!

Gloucester Head – wins for Mx MasD 8, WMasD 4x- and Low CRI W4x+

Vets Head – WMasD 4x- had a strong race and placed 2 in the CD category and  $1^{\rm st}$  in D

Now looking ahead to gauge squad availability for BAR, Monmouth, Hereford and GB Masters.

#### <u>Safety</u>

We have taken lots of learnings following a number of incidents on the river and recognise that we can do things better in the squad.

On the weekly email outing plan, I have now started to identify one person per crew to be responsible for making sure that basic boat checks have all been completed before boating to make sure the safety features are in working order and help to reduce the risks of harm if we do capsize or have an incident.

It's important to remember that we are all responsible for our own safety but I hope this new approach will help to remind everyone of the basic checks so that they become a part of every crew member's routine every outing.

#### **MENS' SQUAD REPORT**

We had a fair number of crews entered for ASH earlier in the month, which was unfortunately cancelled due to high water, but I'm pleased to say we had a reasonable turnout for the Gloucester Spring Head on 17 March (a low CRI 4x-, a low CRI 4x+ and two eights). A great day of racing and some decent times. And useful race experience for our newer members.

Jon's 8 took on Vesta this weekend (hope all went well!). I'm hopeful we can manage at least one other entry next year with a decent period of training in the run up.

Looking ahead, we have an eight entered into the Head of the Dart on 13 April, and I will start looking at crews for Bristol Avon Regatta on 11 May, based on those who have expressed interest on our racing availability sheet. The sheet now includes all of our targeted races for the summer period.

I've had a good response to some proposed training around sculling, steering and coxing, and I will start looking at how we get this moving in the coming weeks, perhaps aligning the sculling training in particular with one or more LTR sessions.



Finally, I will be circulating a survey in the coming month to better understand our members' preferences and aspirations. This should help with planning and squad development in the coming months.

#### **SAFETY REPORT**

Report for Committee Meeting 25<sup>th</sup> March 2024 - Incidents 2023/24 ACRC Incidents reported since the last meeting.

19.4.24 08:20	Julia Wood in her own single reports, "I was proceeding downstream about 400m downstream of the Minerva landing stages when a Bath Uni men's 8 stopped and turned about 50 m ahead of me forcing me to stop or t bone them. Fast stream so I was going reasonably quickly. Bath cox was a girl with thick rimmed glasses who declined to acknowledge me when I asked if it was a sensible place to turn. No coach. Dangerous practice which should go on the list of things to highlight with them".	27099
23.3.24 08:30	Ella Ford steering Chris Hopper was going up stream on the correct side of the river with Bristol coming downstream, just after the moored boats on the bend just upstream of the club. Ella reports, "Bristol Uni were in a pair in the middle of the river coming downstream however because of glare I struggled to see them. The boats did not collide but the stroke blade of the pair hit the heads of the AVN crew. Everyone seems to be okay but quite shaken and in shock". The steering in Chris Hopper has broken and will need fixing. More information has been requested from UBBC's W2	27100



#### Comments & Matters Arising

- Recent updates to safety information was shared more widely with members in an Rowing Notices on March 2<sup>nd</sup>
- Some feedback from club members on the posters and safety information has been received, with overall response positive. Some members have said they found the matrix interesting and has made them think (a positive sign). We will now start to print posters and trial within the club.
- Canoe Avon raised questions around Fire Risk and emergency plans. Jon was able to signpost them to our emergency on the safety notice board. One of the concerns was a lack of visual information of where to go if there is a fire and where the meeting point is. The proposal is that we move the fire assembly point from the centre of the gravel area (current point) to the gravel area near the pond. We would then have a fire assembly point sign created and put up at that point – giving a visual cue to all users. For Discussion

#### HRSA Monthly Report – January 2024

(This is a monthly report we receive on notable safety incidents and updates from across all

Other learning from club incidents include:

- Our 4x+ incident was highlighted in the February report with the heading Larger boats capsize too – It included praise for the way the incident was handled "The subsequent actions were exemplary". Well done to everyone involved. It also highlighted another 4x+ that had capsized elsewhere when doing single strokes – all the blades were not fully square at the catch and the crew fell in. Reminder that its important to ensure the drills are appropriate for the conditions.
- Take care with contaminated water there has been a rise in rowers experiencing illness from the water. One rower contracted a bacterial infection after capsizing (despite coming in straight away and showering and being well after the capsize). In another incident a rower contracted cellulitis (it makes the skin painful, hot and swollen) from the water which if not treated quickly can be very serious. Both these rowers needed treatment with anti-biotics and one with anti-sickness medication. Another rower had water splashed in their face, eyes and mouth contracting nausea, diarrhoea and abdominal pain despite washing their face and showering. Please remind member to be aware if they come into contact with the water and to seek medical advice.
- In Jan 2024 notice RNLI advised blankets for rescue for those who have entered the water: "The best ones are officially called a disrobe pack like this: <a href="https://www.respirex.com/en/products/pre-decontamination-modesty-pack">https://www.respirex.com/en/products/pre-decontamination-modesty-pack</a>. They have a fleece like lining that



absorbs water off the casualty. There is a more widely available version that is foil lined, it is a heavy duty waterproof poncho. There is more information <a href="here">here</a>". Do we want to follow this and upgrade provision of foils in kits?
